

Registered Disability Savings Plan information

The Registered Disability Savings Plan (RDSP) is a new savings plan that will allow funds to be invested tax-free until withdrawal, to help parents and others save for the long-term financial security of a family member with a disability.

An RDSP can be set up by anyone who is a) eligible for the Disability Tax Credit and is a Canadian Resident, or b) a parent or legal representative of such a person. Anyone can contribute to an RDSP, however contributions are limited to a lifetime maximum of \$200,000, with no annual limit. Contributions are permitted until the end of the year the child reaches 59 years of age.

The Canada Disabilities Savings Grant (CDSG) and the Canada Disabilities Savings Bond (CDSB) are two programs designed to help build up these RDSPs. Within BC 'Persons with Disabilties' funding is not affected by the RDSP.

The Royal Bank and Bank of Montreal are participating in this program. Bank staff could help you set up an RDSP, and you can find out more at www.rdsp.com The BC Government is complementing the RDSP with the Vancouver Foundation 150 plan - www.vancouverfoundation.bc.ca/specialprojects/endowment150.htm



Diane and I are preparing a kit to go to the Bless China International (BCI) agro tech farm for a few weeks: a cooking pot, dishes, clothes, some health teaching materials. A dozen (subsistence) farmers are training there next week. We have been asked to go and support the program.

Here is a picture of the last training. We are preparing the ground to plant some new hedges. Notice that the farm is pretty hilly, and we are the last farm on the dirt road before you climb up the mountain in the background on a trail. There is a special method of farming so they can make even the worst hilltop soil better.

My experience these days is of hope, and answered prayer. Yet we are aware of our need for a government recognized longer term role and visa. We press on, accepting the opportunities we are finding to serve, aware of those in Heb. 11 who are examples for us.
