#### Joy Fellowship Financial Report – Dec.31, 2010

The following information was provided at the March 19, 2011 AGM, reporting the December 31, 2010 Year End results:

Camp Fees & Helper Donations were 11,518 lower in 2010, but Camp expenses were proportionately lower. "Bequests" were also lower by \$9,246 during 2010. On the expense side, the major increases were for Wages and Benefits (increased \$17,648) and Automobile Operation (increase of \$5,646). The forgoing increased expenses were partially offset by reductions in other areas, but a deficit nevertheless occurred.

Your Joy Fellowship Board is thankful to the Lord for His many blessings including your faithful support. Psalm 121 verse 8 says "The LORD will keep your going out and your coming in from this time forth and forevermore" and upon this promise we stand.

On January 26<sup>th</sup> our Lord took another of our Joy Fellowship flock, Pieter Versteeg, to be with Him. There was the grief for family and friends, which always accompanies such an event, but there was also a sense of relief as Pieter's last days were spent as an Alzheimer patient. Always alongside him was his wife Joan.

Both Pieter and Joan were of Dutch extraction. Joan was born and raised in Holland and Pieter in Indonesia. During the 2nd world war, while still a boy, Pieter, along with his family, was interned as a prisoner of the Japanese military. I could see that he felt it had had a marked influence on him. He did tell me that he didn't hold any bitterness against the Japanese and that he had even made friends of some of his captors.

After the war he studied engineering in Holland completing his degree later in Canada. It was in Holland that he met and fell in love with Joan. Pieter preceded Joan in moving to Canada. She followed him 9 years later and they were married. They had two children Loeki and Matthew. Loeki was born with physical and mental disabilities. She lived for most of her life at home and was a beloved daughter. Matthew married and they gave Pieter and Joan three lovely granddaughters.

Pieter and Joan were introduced to Joy Fellowship through a young volunteer student who met Loeki at Oakridge School. He volunteered also in Joy Fellowship and told her parents about our church. At the time I met Pieter, he and Joan had no church affiliation and Joy Fellowship became their church.

Pieter became a loyal member of the Joy Fellowship Council and we appreciated his wise counsel. He served faithfully on said Council until his sickness. What impressed me most about Pieter was his loving relationship with his daughter Loeki. Whenever he was home he provided much of her care and whenever I saw them they were enjoying one another. As we got to know Loeki we got to know Pieter and the fun he added to her life. He was a great Dad to Loeki!




Ruth, Dave Sr, Fred and Florence Metzger

#### Joy Fellowship in Newfoundland

Many of us will remember **Stephanie McLellan** who was an Intern with Joy Fellowship a few years ago. Steph is now a Pastor in St. Anthony, Newfoundland. The following updates are taken from Steph's emails:

"I am beginning a new and much needed ministry out here for people in St Anthony. It is a mission and ministry with and for people with disabilities and the church board voted for the mission idea and the programming unanimously. Can we use the name Joy Fellowship as it says so brilliantly what we want to be about?"

We are the only program option of this sort along the coast. The people of the church are incredibly excited to host this and branch out in this ministry direction and the folks with disabilities cant wait to come. The Spirit is amongst us here with joy for all. God is so good!

We meet weekly on Thursdays. The folks have requested 15 minutes of exercises each week and the lunch. The rest of the time we do music - hymns and choruses (they are enjoying learning some sign language) or some crafts or a bit of both. Also some games. Always singing and saying grace. Core group has stabilized to about 25 attendees. There are two community/government groups who want to give us grants to cover costs, so we're in negotiations to be sure that it can remain a church outreach and ministry before we agree to accept their donations. (They later received a \$1000 to help the buy nutritional snacks and get some supplies.)

I would love to introduce our group to Joy Fellowship Vancouver through letters and videos, so you'll likely get greetings someday soon. Thanks for the prayers and support.

Our Joy Fellowship sends our prayers to this new Joy Fellowship in Newfoundland. Bless you and your congregations, Steph. We are hoping for pictures of your group for the next newsletter.

(Since our Joy Fellowship was founded 37 years ago, there are now Joy Fellowships in Taiwan, New Zealand, Richmond and Sechelt—Editor.)

We went to San Jose by faith..... and it was a blessing. God prepared ahead everything for us over there. We had a meeting with a wonderful lady who has worked for 25 years in Latin America with people with Special Needs . THEY DON'T HAVE A FULL SERVICE CHURCH FOR SPECIAL NEEDS.

We were full of Joy to talk about Joy Fellowship and our people. The Pastor and his wife talked about their Church and very interested about starting a Service for people with disabilities.


